# 2.0 INTRODUCTION TO PROJECT



### 3.0 REQUIREMENTS OF PROJECT

- There are 3 types of recycling bins and they are: Recyclables, Landfill Waste and Broken Shards
- Users do not have to create an account to start the game.
- It will be a plugin on our Website, not a mobile application.
- The game will start with different types of wastes appearing at the bottom of the screen, and users will have to drag and drop them into the correct classification of waste. Sample of wastes are available in Table 1 below.
- Users will have thirty seconds to sort as much waste as they can. Once the timer is up, the total score will be calculated.
- Users get 1 point for each correct classification. 0 points for incorrect classifications. Prizes are summarised in Table 2.
- At the end of the game, users are asked if they would like to make a donation to the NGO in support of reducing plastic waste
